

Welcome to the 50th Walnut Valley Festival Something Gold, Something New



In September 1972, luthier Stuart Mossman spoke to the Winfield Rotary Club about plans for the first Walnut Valley Festival. The Winfield Courier summarized: "Those attending will be people who like country and bluegrass music. Many are over fifty years of age and will bring their families along. Mossman pointed out the entire festival will provide good, clean family entertainment."

Anyone who attended that first festival is certainly over fifty years of age—and some of us who didn't start attending until much later are, too!

Stuart was one of three founding members of the Walnut Valley Association, the business entity that stages the festival. He, Joe Muret, and Bob Redford incorporated the organization in March 1972; six months later, the National Flat-Pick Guitar Contest debuted.

Of course, the three founders were not acting alone, even in the early days. They built on

what Sam Ontjes and his collaborators had learned from a folk festival they put on at Southwestern College in 1967. They also used the lessons Mossman, Art Eskridge, and their crew picked up putting on the Walnut Valley Folk Festival at Southwestern in 1971. They got advice from Dan Crary.

To make the first WVF happen, the founders leaned on spouses, families, church friends, Jaycees, the Southwestern College community, staff from the Mossman Guitar Factory, and bluegrass fans. Redford and the WVA tried to compensate everyone involved; some worked for an hourly wage, and most worked for a festival pass. Some festivals have volunteers; Winfield has workers.

Four stories emerged from the debut WVF:

- 1) The "parking lot pickin" was great fun for pickers and listeners alike.
- 2) The on-stage jam featuring flatpickers Doc Watson, Norman Blake, and Dan Crary was legendary.
- 3) The weather was terrible.
- 4) Organizers decided to do it again next year.

Sound familiar?

In many ways, the elements of the festival we love were there from the beginning.



Rituals matter for communities. As you enjoy this milestone festival, I invite you to notice and appreciate anew the reassuring sameness. My touchstones include the weather breaks on Walnut Valley's own campground radio station (105.7 mHz) when I am driving from town to the fairground, a favorite security worker who always smiles while checking bags, and at least one plate of biscuits and gravy, preferably somewhere around 2 a.m.



I'll also be listening to plenty of my favorite artists. I'll see Bryan Bowers, who was the first folkie I discovered on my own instead of from my folks' record collection. I'll cry during at least one John Mc-Cutcheon song, and I'll sing too loud at sets by The Steel Wheels and Bing Futch and Marley's Ghost and Socks in the Frying Pan and Still on the Hill.

What are your rituals?

Communities also need to be refreshed. This year, for example, you will spot the expanded Picking Pub, the beer and wine garden that debuted last year. You might get to know vendors and TV hosts the Chapmans at their Acoustic Shoppe booth, or visit with the Sparks Music crew, also offering great instruments and accessories. I plan to visit all of those spots. I also plan this year to be a little braver about visiting new jams in addition to hanging out where I am already comfortable.

There will be plenty of fresh talent in the stages—artists new to Winfield and legends who have come in new configurations. I got to see one of Béla Fleck's Bluegrass Heart shows last year with my family and my banjo-picking dad. I can't wait to see the lineup Béla is bringing to WVF 50, including the incomparable Sierra Hull on mandolin. I'm going to check out Irish fingerstyle guitar player Shane Hennessy, banjo player and singer-songwriter Kelly Hunt, and Weda Skirts featuring the extraordinary songcraft of Elexa Dawson. And, of course, I'm going to be cheering for the queen of bluegrass, Rhonda Vincent and her band, the Rage.

What will you do to refresh your Winfield?

Communities need to celebrate, too, and 50 Winfields is a great reason to do so. Thanks to creator Ken Gale and director Allyson Moon, Southwestern College has celebrated by performing Winfield, A Bluegrass Musical. If you are reading

this before Sept. 11, please come to the free Sunday matinee, free to festival ticket-holders. Wear your wristband and sing along!

With the kind cooperation of the WVA, my celebration has included releasing Winfield's Walnut Valley Festival, a book that includes festival history and memories from many perspectives. It's available from the Mercantile, and I'll be signing it at various times through the weekend—or just stop me when you see me.

I hope when you leave this year, you will feel reconnected to what you love about Winfield. I hope you will feel refreshed (even if you are over 50 years of age). Most of all, I hope you will come back "home" next year. "Not every year can be the 50th. But every year is the best year to come to Winfield."

Festival Rules Apply When Campgrounds Open Sept. 8_____

Wristbands Tickets must be exchanged for wristbands and they must be worn at all times starting at 5pm on Sept. 8. *Persons without wristbands or authorized IDs cannot visit or camp.*

Daily Tickets One-day tickets are good from 6am to 30 minutes after the interior stages close on the ticket day. You may not camp or stay overnight.

No firearms, illegal drugs, or animals allowed on grounds. When you enter the interior (stages, crafts concessions) you are subject to search of your person, including handbags, backpacks and vehicles. Law enforcement officers and festival security may conduct searches of your person anywhere on festival grounds.

Emergency Medical Services EMTs are on duty south of the Grandstand to provide first aid during the Festival. They are on duty Wed. 6pm - midnight; Thurs., Fri. & Sat. 8am - midnight; and Sun. 8am - 5pm.

Lost Children and Lost Items Please check at EMS Services south of the grandstand for lost children, and the Information Booth under the grandstand for lost items.

Sales of Craft Items and Instruments All sales of craft items and instruments have been prearranged (pg. 34-35). No sales of items or services on grounds unless authorized by WVA.

Campground Neighbor Your campground neighbor would appreciate no loud noise in the campgrounds after midnight, including radios and CD players. Persons causing a disturbance will be asked to leave the grounds with NO refund.

Parkin' Lot Pickin' There will be parkin' lot pickin' all night. This is why many Festival folks like to camp out. As long as this type of music is played, we do not expect that to disturb anyone.

CAMPGROUND FIRE SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

• Fire Lanes will be maintained and kept open at all times.

- All Wheels & Body of vehicle Must Be off the Roadway.
 Campfires will be maintained within a metal fire ring. Fire rings shall be no larger than 3ft. diameter and must be at least 12 inches in height. No bonfires permitted. Campfires may not be left unattended. Bring your own fire rings. There may be a limited number at the gate for purchase.
- The use of straw or woodchips will not be permitted in camp if a campfire is being used.
- Fire extinguishers or one gallon sized container of water to be kept immediately available for emergency use at all times.
- Hot charcoal only disposed of in metal barrels provided that are marked "Hot Charcoal Only", or be thoroughly soaked with water before emptying from the grill.
- No flammable liquids (eg. gasoline or Coleman fuel) to be used to start campfires.
- No open flame (tiki) patio torches permitted.
- No fire art is allowed. Fire art refers to performances such as fire breathing, fire juggling, fire dancing, etc.
- No flying Chinese sky lanterns or fireworks of any kind per City of Winfield fire ordinances.
- Commercial vendors using grills or smokers must have fire extinguisher present at all times.
- Check the gas and electric items on your camper for safety *prior* to use at the Festival.

Camping Fee Camping on Festival grounds is \$15 per day per unit. Extra permits are required for large shelters, tarps, tents, etc. Car only permits are \$12 per day. Camping is only available to Full Festival (5-day) and Two Day ticket holders. No roped areas without permits!

Electric Hookups More than 1,000 electric hookups are available in the Pecan Grove and West Campgrounds. The fee is \$12 per day and available on a first-come basis.

Generators To keep noise at a minimum, generators are not to be used in camping areas from 10pm - 8am.

Campground Access Campgrounds will be open after Land Rush on Thursday, Sept 8 Land Rush will begin at 7am. When Land Rush is finished, the Campgrounds are open for all campers. Full Festival tickets include admission to the Wednesday Concert. **Campground Parking**

- Only Full Festival and Two Day ticket holders can park vehicles in the campgrounds and they must have permits.
- Long-term parking is available for campers not wishing to pay a permit fee for an extra vehicle.
- Single Day ticket holders may park in day parking.

Vehicles parked within a designated roadway, fire lane, or blocking another vehicle may be towed at owner's expense. When parking on roads, including 14th Ave. and roads into campgrounds, vehicles must have tires off the roadway and firelane. This is for your safety and the safety of other campers.

Handicapped Camping and Parking Area Inquire upon entry for available areas. Only small handicap-required mobility vehicles are allowed in the interior.

Authorized Vehicles

No unauthorized vehicles (including bicycles) allowed in the Interior.

• Bicycles must have headlights on the front and red reflectors on the rear if used at night. Please drive on the right side of the streets/roads on the fairgrounds, and drive slowly and safely.

♦ Drivers of golf carts must be 18 years old with valid driver's license; owners shall provide proof of liability insurance. <u>Golf carts are allowed on the fairgrounds but not on Winfield city streets.</u> If used at night, carts **MUST** have a headlight with a beam projecting out 25 feet **AND** a rear facing red marker light for safety. Flashlights, low ouput LEDs, and closet lights are not acceptable as lights. Riders are limited to the seats on the carts.

 \$10.00 will be assessed on each golf cart brought onto the fairgrounds.

♦ Due to persistent complaints about noise, speed, and exhaust, no unauthorized Gas or Electric powered ATVs/UTVs will be allowed on grounds during festival. Authorized ATVs/UTVs include those operated by WVA, Security, Vendors and Local Emergency Personnel.

- Gas scooters, motorcycles, and mopeds are not authorized during the Festival due to safety concerns.
- Motorcycles must be parked in motorcycle parking area by main gate entrance.
- Skateboards, roller blades and other such items are prohibited from Sept. 8 18.

WVA is not responsible for any damage or loss of vehicles or conveyances. WVA requests that all Festival people who use the authorized items listed above be very careful during the Festival for their safety and that of others and obey any and all traffic laws.

Campground Comforts

Locally-cut firewood is available near the showers.



Ice Stations are located at the west interior north gate entrance by Stage IV and by the showers. An ice trailer runs daily through the campgrounds.

Coffee, donuts, milk, and juice are available from the Winfield Masonic Lodge on Festival mornings. Listen for their tractors as they roam the West, Pecan Grove and North Campgrounds.

RV Service & Sales will be available on-grounds at the 54 Auto & RV Booth located near the Horse Barn. 54 Auto & RV personnel are available for simple service & repairs, as well as offering sales of RV &/or camping items. Call 316-775-1646 for information or assistance.

United Rentals is available to pump trailer waste at a cost of \$45. **Please go to the Ticket Trailer or Information Booth to complete a Service Request Form to request this service.** United Rentals 817-302-9207

Port-a-johns are stationed throughout the campgrounds. Report any service problems to the Information Booth, 620-221-3250.

AODAN COYNE Traditional Irish Guitar Accompaniment (Beg. to Intermed. Skills) 10am - 4pm Explore DADGAD Tuning and Irish Music. Subjects will be jig & Reel Rhythm, Open up the Guitar Neck, Major & Minor Chords Beginner to Intermed. Skill Level Cost is \$75 per student Maximum 20 participants.

Get hands-on experience with shuffle rhythms and barre chords as you learn the basic song patterns while learning how to add hot licks Cost is \$40 for one session Maximum 30 participants and solos.

CINDY HARRIS Intermediate / Advanced Autoharp - Morning & Afternoon Session 9am - 4pm The morning session will start with a review of rhythm including a variety of accompaniment techniques and some work on damping and progress into some repertoire that will allow us to exercise those skills, driving rhythm into the melody. The afternoon session will explore jigs, English dance tunes, American fiddle tunes, and maybe some waltzes, focusing on playing smooth melody lines and utilizing alternate chordings. Service Animal Policy

Recently our festival has experienced an increased SERVICE ANIMAL DESCRIPTION: attendance of non-service animal pets, who have accompanied their owners in violation of Kansas and federal law. Moreover, these animals have compromised the health and safety of festival patrons and legitimate service animals. As a result, we have been forced to develop a service animal policy and procedure. The policy and procedure will be strictly enforced and implemented in the interest of ensuring that bona fide service animals are permitted and all other animals are prohibited from Walnut Valley Festival. By law, if an animal's purpose or task is to provide protection, emotional support, well-being, comfort, or companionship, it is NOT considered a service animal and may NOT attend the festival with you.

Qualified and bona fide service animals are welcome at the Walnut Valley festival. Pets and non-service animals are NOT permitted. It is a crime to misrepresent a pet as a service animal. Those who bring any animal other than a service animal will not be allowed admittance. All service animals must be trained for a specific function, related to a disability, housebroken, leashed and under the direct control of their handler at all times. If any handler does not adhere to these conditions, the handler will be asked to remove the animal from the festival. The handler may then return without the animal.

Walnut Valley Festival reserves the right to refuse service to any individual whose conduct poses a direct threat to the health or safety of other individuals or service animals.





Pre-Festival workshops are held at the First Baptist Church, 200 E. 11th Ave., in Winfield. Free shuttle service is available. Please meet at the Contestant Warm-up Tent west of Stage IV OR under the EMS Awning Beginning at 8:30am to take the shuttle.

Under the American Disabilities Act (ADA), a service animal is defined as a dog that has been individually trained to do work or perform tasks for an individual with a disability. The task(s) performed by the dog must be directly related to the person's disability.

ADA is also clear that emotional support, therapy, comfort, or companion animals are not considered service animals and are not permitted in the festival and campground. Though we prefer that Service Dogs have proper identification (vest, documentation, etc.) when you bring them, this is not required. Please be prepared to answer two questions upon entry: 1) Is the dog a service animal required because of a disability? and 2) What work or task has the dog been trained to perform?

Even service animals may be excluded and you may be asked to leave the premises if the service animal is disruptive, the handler is unable to take effective control of the service animal, or the service animal is not housebroken and grounds not maintained. We want all our guests to have a safe and enjoyable experience at the festival. For more

3 TRAILS WEST is passionate about vintage Western Music. We've dug deep to uncover recordings that got left in the dust. Our journey has taken us down some old rutted swales, Trails Less Traveled, you might say. We hope our music sounds familiar in the way that only a good Cowboy song can; like putting on a favorite shirt, a little faded and frayed at the collar, but more comfortable for the wear."

Their approach is drawn from the Silver Screen Era of Cowboy Music and Bob Wills-style swing. Laced with humor and audience interaction, 3TW is a family-oriented show band. They also spend as much as they make on wardrobe, so their on-stage appearance is an eye-catching sight.

3 TRAILS WEST is comprised of a tight vocal trio/rhythm section backed by a "Cowboy Orchestra" including accordion, fiddle and steel guitar. Formed in 2006, they are the recipients of the 2011 Crescendo Award from the International Western Music Association. They are also finalists in the Category of Swing Album of the Year for 2014 and 2018. They were awarded the 2015 "Duo/Group" of the year from the IWMA and also the Academy of Western Artists. Stephen Bennett & Bill Gurley

After many years of individual pursuits, *Stephen Bennett and Bill Gurley* are making music together again. These two musicians began writing, recording, and performing together in the late 1980s. Stephen had distinguished himself at the National Guitar Championships in Winfield, Kansas while Bill had been a member of several progressive acoustic bands: Bottle Hill, The New Morning String Band, and Morning Flight. The two were instant kindred spirits, joined by a deep love of acoustic string music in its many forms.

Bill happened to be present on the day that Stephen's first harp guitar arrived by delivery truck, a very old instrument that had belonged to his great grandfather. The sound was captivating. No one could have known at the time that he would go on to play a significant role in the worldwide revival of interest in the harp guitar. Stephen's large recorded body of work, comprised of his compositions and arrangements for that instrument, as well as standard guitars, has solidified his legacy as one of the top stylists of his generation.

A multi instrumentalist, Bill moves effortlessly from guitar to fiddle to banjo and more. Over the years, he has performed and recorded several albums with his wife Pam. Aside from playing, writing and recording music, Bill's also been a very active teacher and mentor to students of all ages. Other artists often seek him out to perform with them on recordings and live shows.



A reunion of Bennett & Gurley is not to be missed! Their talents and love for the music, combined with decades of dedication to their craft, make for a musical reunion to be enjoyed and savored.



Bryan Bowers

Bryan Bowers' creativity and talent have won him induction into Frets Magazine's First Gallery of the Greats, after five years of winning the stringed instrument open category of the magazine's readers'poll. This distinction put Bowers alongside other luminaries, such as Chet Atkins, David Grisman, Stephan Grappelli, Itzhak Perlman, Tony Rice, Rob Wasserman and Mark O'Connor, recognized for their personal accomplishments. In 1993, Bryan was the first living member inducted into the Autoharp Hall of Fame to stand only with Maybelle Carter, Kilby Snow, and Sara Carter. In 2003, Bryan organized and co-produced Autoharp Legacy. He brought together 55 autoharp players and created the definitive three-CD set on autoharp music.

From his rather unglamorous beginning as a street singer, *Bryan Bowers* has become a major artist on the traditional music circuit. He has redefined the autoharp and is also well known as a singer-songwriter. Bryan has a dynamic outgoing personality and an uncanny ability to enchant a crowd in practically any situation. His towering six foot four inch frame can be wild and zany on stage while playing a song like `Dixie' and five minutes later he can have the same audience singing `Will The Circle Be Unbroken' in quiet reverence and delight. Premier autoharpist, singer and Colorado folk legend *Roz Brown* has built an impressive career as a captivating entertainer and recording artist, performing and recording classic folk music on his own terms for over 40 years. Roz has released five albums, the latest being *A Cowboy and His Sweetheart*, which was produced by his son, Memphis/ Nashville keyboardist and producer Paul Brown. Inspired by his sweetheart, Barbara, the album is a collection of romantic love songs which were originally recorded by country legend Don Williams. Roz performs more than 300 dates a year giving back to the community by performing in retirement and nursing homes. Roz is a regular at the Buckhorn Exchange in Denver where he's performed over thirty years. For more information, visit rozbrown.com.

Jim Ratts has been Roz Brown's record producer and engineer for 25 years, providing vocal harmony for those releases. Born in St. John, Kansas, Jim's Lubbock, Texas college band Colours moved to Colorado in '71 and toured for 5 years with the likes of John Hartford, Earl Scruggs, Steve Martin and the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band. That Dirt Band connection led to a 40-year partnership with Jimmy Ibbotson, including their Wild Jimbo's MCA record produced by Sam Bush. Jim and his wife Salli have performed with their band Runaway Express since 1980, and have done extensive touring with the Dirt Band's



John McEuen. Jim's written songs for The Dillards, The Limeliters, and The Kingston Trio, and penned "*Howlin' At The Moon*", a bluegrass chart hit for Sam Bush. Tom Chapin & Friends

Tom Chapin launched his solo recording career with 1976's Life Is Like That. It was the first of a string of albums that further established his reputation as both a gifted storyteller and a natural entertainer, winning him an uncommonly loyal fan base in the process. He also continued to venture into other creative areas, playing the lead role in the hit Broadway musical Pump Boys and Dinettes, working off-Broadway as musical director of both Cotton Patch Gospel and Harry Chapin: Lies and Legends, and serving as host of TV's National Geographic Explorer. He's also written and performed satirical topical songs for National Public Radio's Morning Edition, and had a cameo role as the Vice Presidential candidate in Jonathan Demme's 2004 remake of The Manchurian Candidate.

Jon Cobert is a studio musician, composer and arranger and has written the themes for ESPN's "Baseball Tonight" and "College Football Gameday" shows, as well as hundreds of TV and radio jingles. Jon has released the first CD of his own original songs, "HERE'S YOUR CANOE." Due to popular demand, he has just released a CD of solo piano recordings appropriately titled "STANDARDS ON SOLO PIANO." It

consists of Jon playing some old favorites, plus a few "newer" tunes. No muss, no fuss, just a piano and a piano player. Like the good old days, only digital. Please visit Jon's website for further information.

Joining Tom and Jon on stage is their good friend and collaborator, *Michael Mark*. *Michael Mark* is perhaps best known for writing the theme for TV's "Entertainment Tonight." Michael and Tom have collaborated on music for the children's musical, The Magic Fishbone, as well as songs for Tom's award-winning family and adult recordings. Both Michael and Jon have collaborated with Tom and are featured musicians on his award-winning children's and adult recordings and appear in Tom's live concert video. They have each earned 5 Grammy nominations for their work as producers on Tom Chapin's recordings.

Crary, Evans & Barnick

Dan Crary is a pioneer of flatpicking guitar solos in a bluegrass band, right up there with founding fathers Doc Watson, Clarence White and Norman Blake in carving a role for the flatpick guitar soloist in bluegrass music. A founding member of the Bluegrass Alliance, and the "newgrass" approach, his 20+ year collaboration with Byron Berline and John Hickman (as BCH and in the bands Sundance & California) earned him numerous awards and accolades.

Bill Evans is an internationally loved five-string banjo life force. Whether he's lending his instrumental chops to a blazing fiddle tune or performing one of his original compositions, Bill is one of contemporary banjo's treasures. He's at home with



traditional and contemporary bluegrass as well as branching out on the farthest musical limbs that Dan and Wally can take him.

Wally Barnick (bass & vocals) describes himself as "principally a singer who some 40 years ago took up playing bass guitar in order to ensure a place in the band." His warm vocals and engaging stage presence are a perfect complement to Dan and Bill's instrumental fireworks.

A Crary, Evans & Barnick show includes new songs and old stories, blazing instrumental artistry, and deep-down, powerfully-felt musical moments. it's the hovering ghosts of Jimmie Rogers and The Carter Family and Bill and Lester and Earl and Woody and all the greats who showed the way.



Damn Tall Buildings

In their early days, Damn Tall Buildings didn't rehearse - they busked. Now, whether live or on record, the band still radiates the energy of a ragtag crew of music students playing bluegrass on the street. But anchoring that energy is their instrumental chops, their strong songwriting, and their varied influences that stretch beyond bluegrass, even beyond American roots music altogether. Whether sharing lead vocals and instrumental solos or blending their voices into loose, joyous harmony, the three members of Damn Tall Buildings (guitarist/lead vocalist Max Capistran, bassist/lead vocalist Sasha Dubyk, and fiddler/vocalist Avery Ballotta) blend elements of bluegrass, blues, roots-rock and vintage swing to create a captivating, high-energy sound. Since their busking days, they've made three albums: 2014's Cure-All, 2015's self-titled, their third album, 2019's Don't Look Down, and their fourth Album Sleepng Dogs, is coming in 2022. The band has relocated to Brooklyn, NY and toured widely, sharing stages with Sierra Hull and the California Honeydrops and appearing at festivals like Grey Fox Bluegrass Festival, Philadelphia Folk Festival, and Freshgrass Festival, where they took second place in the 2016 band competition. Their lyrics find beauty and glory in the mundane, workaday struggle of everyday life: time keeps passing, you

don't like your job, you drink too much, you laugh with your friends, you search for a home, and you dream about what else might be out there. You carry on. This is what Damn Tall Buildings sings about, what they seek to share with their audience.

Béla Fleck My Bluegrass Heart

My Bluegrass Heart is the third chapter of a trilogy which began with the 1988 album, *Drive*, and continued in 1991 with *The Bluegrass Sessions*. The project features a who's who of some of the greatest instrumentalists in bluegrass music's history alongside some of the best of the new generation of players.

My Bluegrass Heart is a sign that Fleck, the world's premier banjo virtuoso has dug deep into his instrument's complex global history and unlocked the breadth of its possibilities. My Bluegrass Heart is a homecoming in sound.

"I have almost always played and recorded my bluegrass projects with the folks from my own age and peer group. But for this album, I wanted to open up to the fresh and powerfully evolved musicians who have come along. The tour will feature some of the best known players in the bluegrass genre."

Featured along with *Béla Fleck* are *Billy Contreras, Sierra Hull, Justin Moses, Shaun Richardson, and Mark Schatz.* All are experienced bluegrass musicians and well known for their musical prowess. This is a show that is not to be missed.





Bing Futch

With a big smile *Bing Futch* kicks off every performance with a buoyant energy that is inviting and energizing. Using Appalachian mountain dulcimer, Native American flute, ukulele, drums and electronic effects, he deftly navigates the varied waters of traditional and modern Americana with passion, wit and a genuinely huge heart for sharing music with a crowd.

He has recorded a number of albums and published several music-education books including the best-selling Blues Method For Mountain Dulcimer 101. His love for blues music has led him to teach workshops on playing Delta blues on the mountain dulcimer all across the country as well as writing articles on the subject in Mel Bay's Dulcimer Sessions and Dulcimer Players News. As a member of the Orange Blossom Blues Society, he helps with the organization's mission of presenting, preserving and promoting the blues by participating in the "Blues In The Schools" program in central Florida.

Known for his musical shape-shifting, Futch switches the channels on style with every new song, sung in a limber tenor voice and woven together with the other instruments. His casual way with any audience, coupled with a fierce originality on the lesser known mountain dulcimer, makes each show a one-of-a-kind and good-timing romp. 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Beppe Gambetta

After eleven CDs, DVDs, teaching books and collaborations with many other top-flight musicians, Gambetta is increasingly known as one of the true live master innovators of the acoustic guitar. While *Beppe Gambetta* still lives in his native Genova, his reputation in the U.S. and Canada is reinforced by his participation in prestigious festivals like the Walnut Valley Festival, Merlefest, the Four Corners Festival, as well as events like the radio shows "All Things Considered" and "E-Town". In his career he has performed with some great heroes of the folk scene like David Grisman, Gene Parsons, Doc Watson, Norman Blake and with the band Men Of Steel: an international guitar summit (Dan Crary, Tony McManus and Don Ross) of different guitar schools. In a world dominated by the trends and logic of the market *Gambetta*'s playing and singing stand out for their intimate emotions, communication, research in tone, sobriety and humor.

Beppe plays an inspired music that modestly avoids relying solely on his high level of technical excellence, but also reveals the innermost feelings of a brilliant, playful mind that is always exploring and innovating while staying firmly rooted in tradition. With America in his heart and his roots in the sun and the olive trees of the Mediterranean sea, he naturally and seamlessly bridges the shores of the two continents, creating in spite of the interposed ocean a musical "koiné" (fusion) where American root music and Ligurian tradition, emigration songs and folk ballads, steel string guitars and vintage harp guitars not only co-exist but interact, weaving a deep dialog unaware of any rigid classification. GASS

GASS is a gospel-singing group of four friends who sing and play to share Jesus through music. Gospel songs comprise most of the repertoire, along with an occasional secular song. Styles include southern gospel, contemporary worship, country and rockabilly.

The group name *GASS* comes from the first letters of their names: *Greg Smyer*, vocals and guitar; *Andy Colclasure*, vocals, bass guitar and drums; *Stan Boggs*, vocals and guitar; and *Susie Knickerbocker*, vocals and keyboard. They make their homes in Kansas and Oklahoma.

GREEN FLAMINGOS

Green Flamingos' sound was forged from the collective, yet varied influences, of *Jesse Friesen* and *"Bobby J" Edwards*. They sometimes refer to their style as "acoustified rock and pseudo-electrified folk," yet even that doesn't cover all the bases. Green Flamingos pulls from all sorts of genres and styles; the group shows its ability to perform an eclectic mix of music. They cover a wide range of styles, but still maintain their signature Flamingos sound.

Jesse Friesen, guitar & vocals, started Green Flamingos in 2012 with his sister, Annie. He has an undying love for acoustic music, primarily Folk and Americana, and in his live shows, you can regularly hear songs you'll recognize. Whether playing solo, as a duo, or with a full band, Jesse excels at connecting with his audience - through songs, stories, and humor - bringing together a memorable experience. Jesse's love for so many styles of music and his eclectic tastes bring a wide variety to Green Flamingos.



"Bobby J" Edwards, ukulele & lead vocals, started playing music and writing songs at a very young age. He joined the band in 2015 and helped create the unique style and feel of Green Flamingos.

Stephen Edwards, drums & vocals, is Bobby J's little brother. After Annie left the band, Steve stepped in to fill her place, along with adding additional vocals to the band. His primary musical love is punk rock, but he has a softer side that really shows with Green Flamingos. Along with drums, Steve plays guitar and sings lead on a few songs.

Eric Matthews, bass & righteous vibes, is the newest Flamingo, but he's been playing music around Wichita, Kansas for many years. He plays with a number of other groups in the area, who all fight over what dates they get to have him. Eric's addition of the lower frequencies really helped fill in the missing piece of Green Flamingos.

Shane Hennessy

Irish virtuoso guitarist *Shane Hennessy* has established himself as one of the leading guitarists on the world stage, known widely for his fingerstyle, flatpicking, and percussive guitar-playing approaches. His energetic live performances and his cinematically-vivid compositions tie in influences from Bach to Beyoncé – and everything in between! With a unique style of solo guitar playing that encompasses the range of a whole band – covering drums, bass, rhythm and lead lines – Shane builds a complete sonic world entirely on his own.

A musician from a young age, Shane credits his background in Irish traditional music as the base on which he has built his genre-defying musical explorations. Initially a concertina player under the tuition of the renowned Mícheál Ó Raghallaigh, he achieved successes in the Fleadh Cheoil competitions in Ireland. He then turned to the guitar aged twelve inspired by the music of James Taylor. Becoming more interested in songwriting and in music in general, it was when he discovered the styles of Tommy Emmanuel and Chet Atkins that his interest in solo performance blossomed. Since that time, he has toured the world with thousands of shows under his belt, four albums of music, and a proven track record as a performer, songwriter, arranger, accompanist, and session musician.

Ernie Hill

Ernie Hill from Figure Five, Arkansas, is a familiar face around Walnut Valley, having been a WVFest writer for over 25 years, along with performing in our Songwriters Showcase. Ernie writes songs and stories for himself and for you. He is bringing his Story Songs concept set back to Walnut Valley along with story telling songwriters, *Chris Jones, Kelly Hunt, and Still on the Hill,* as they perform original story songs and pick each other's brains about each individual process. Ernie has been published by several online magazines such as nodepression.com and ifiddlemag.com and a few hard copies such as the Louisville Pickin' Post, the Houston Cotton Patch Rag, and regularly in the Walnut Valley Occasional. Ernie sings and plays numerous instruments including guitar, old time fiddle, mountain dulcimer and piano. Kelly Hunt

The daughter of an opera singer and a saxophonist, *Kelly Hunt* was raised in Memphis, TN and grew up performing other people's works through piano lessons, singing in choirs, and performing theater. "It was a very creative, artistic household," says Hunt. During her teenage years, influenced by musical inspirations as diverse as Norah Jones, Rachmaninov, and Joni Mitchell, she began writing her own songs on the piano as a creative outlet. After being introduced to the banjo in college while studying French and visual arts, Hunt began to develop her own improvised style of playing, combining old-time picking styles with the percussive origins of the instrument. "I'm self-taught, I just started letting the songs dictate what needed to be there," she says. "I heard a rhythm in a song that I wanted to execute, so I figured out how to do it on the drum head while still being able to articulate certain notes in one motion." After college, Hunt followed a rambling path through various career pursuits including farming, traditional French breadmaking, and graphic design, all the while making music as a private endeavor. "I wanted to get serious about a career, but music kept bubbling up. I was writing a lot and playing a lot and started to not be satisfied just playing to the walls of my room." Pretend Friend is an acoustic quartet from Wichita, KS. Jamie McKeogh, Cathal Guinan and Daithi Melia all hail from Tullamore, Co. Offaly with Co. Tipperary born Gavin Strappe completing the quartet. All four members grew up immersed in Irish traditional music and culture which is reflected by the band collectively achieving over twenty All-Ireland titles at Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann competitions. They have now developed their own unique style of music influenced by American Folk music whilst staying true to their Irish roots.



Described as 'the best Irish group so far in bluegrass' this sharply dressed outfit deliver an energy-fuelled, foot-stomping live performance. All multi-instrumentalists, *JigJam* interchange between banjos, guitars, fiddles, mandolins and double bass onstage which creates an experience which is pleasing to both the eye and the ear.

JigJam have recorded three studio albums ("Oh Boy!" 2014, "Hello World" 2016 & "Phoenix" 2019) to critical acclaim as well as a live album ("Live in Tullamore" 2017). They have made a huge impact on the Irish American circuit performing as a headline act at all the major festivals including the world-renowned Tellruide Bluegrass Festival and Milwaukee Irish Fest as well as touring various parts of the UK and Europe.



Chris Jones & The Night Drivers

Chris Jones' soulful singing, solid guitar skills, and impressive versatility have earned him the respect of some of the best musicians in the world, and he has performed and recorded with a Who's Who in bluegrass music. With his warm sense of humor and deep knowledge of country and bluegrass music history, Chris is also a popular and award-winning host on SiriusXM's Bluegrass Junction and Willie's Roadhouse channels, making him one of the most widely heard broadcasting voices in bluegrass. And in his spare time, he writes a hilarious weekly column for Bluegrass Today.

Mark Stoffel's rhythmic sense and warm tone help to define the band's instrumental sound. Mark has contributed several lively instrumentals to the band's repertoire. He also delights audiences with his sweet rendition of "Edelweiss."

Marshall Wilborn is one of the most respected bass players and songwriters in bluegrass, with a long list of songwriting credits. Marshall and Chris have a long history, having performed together in the Lynn Morris Band and as members of Whetstone Run. Marshall is well-known for his years with the Johnson Mountain Boys, Longview, and Michael Cleveland & Flamekeeper. His rock-solid rhythm and inventive but tasteful solos have earned him the IBMA's Bass Player of the Year award four times, and his engaging vocal style and talent for harmony singing add a new dimension to the Night Drivers' sound.

Grace Van't Hof is a founding member of the Grammy-nominated group Della Mae, as well as a founding member of the popular vintage roots music band Bill & The Belles. Her driving banjo style is influenced by early masters Earl Scruggs and Don Reno, as well as more recent players like Ron Block and Jim Mills. As a self-described "songwriting geek," Grace focuses her playing on what best supports the song. Well-versed in old-time and early country music, she incorporates her ukulele playing into the Night Drivers' repertoire. As most people will tell you, there's an undeniable connection between versatility and variation. Suffice it to say that each depends on the other. In the case of West Coastbased Marley's Ghost, that eclectic energy has resulted in a broad repertoire that has defied any ability to tag them to any one particular genre. Their dozen albums to date — like the output of The Band — survey a broad scope of Americana and acoustic music in general, refusing to confine them to any singular niche.

Composed of singer/multi-instrumentalists *Dan Wheetman, Jon Wilcox, Mike Phelan, Ed Littlefield Jr., Jerry Fletcher, and Bob Nichols*, the band can sing and play anything with spot-on feel, from roots to rock, blues to bluegrass, gospel to stone country, which is what they've been doing – to the ongoing delight of a fervent cult that includes many of their fellow musicians – for over 35 years as a working unit. than three decades from that initial spark, they're still playing together with the same passion, purpose and chemistry that inspired them early on.

"It is, and always has been, about the music," bassist, fiddler, guitarist, singer and chief songwriter *Dan Wheetman* insists. "That's what's kept this band going for so long. It's always been about digging a little deeper, honing our skills and celebrating the entire playing process. That drives us forward."



Andy May

Pat Flynn is no stranger to WVF fans. Pat is listed as Best Acoustic Guitarist in Frets Magazine for five consecutive years. He is best known for his work in the band New Grass Revival and inducted into the Bluegrass Hall of Fame this past November. He is a well known session player in Nashville and records with a long list of top country artists. The Steel Wheels

The Steel Wheels have long been at home in the creative space between tradition and innovation, informed by the familiar sounds of the Virginia mountains where the band was formed, but always moving forward with insightful lyrics and an evolving sound. In 2005, Jay Lapp (vocals, guitars, mandolin) and Eric Brubaker (vocals, fiddle) joined lead singer Trent Wagler (guitar, banjo) in forming the band as a vehicle for Wagler's songwriting. They released several albums under Wagler's moniker, before officially adopting the The Steel Wheels name with the 2010 release of Red Wing. Quickly staking their claim as independent upstarts in the burgeoning Americana scene, The Steel Wheels followed up this release with three more self-produced albums in the next five years, before joining forces with producer Sam Kassirer for Wild As We Came Here (2017) and Over The Trees (2019). Kevin Garcia (drums, percussion, keys) joined in 2017, bringing a new level of sonic depth and polish to the outfit. Derek Kratzer joined the band in 2021 playing bass and adding to the songwriting talent. Having gained the experience of thousands of shows, festivals and many miles on the road, the stubbornly independent band has formed deep bonds with each other and the audience that sustains them.
